SCENARIO

Individually, you will present on a major historical event that took place between 1970 and present day and **CREATE A MULTIMEDIA PRESENTATION THAT YOU WILL GIVE IN CLASS**. A list of eligible events is provided.

Using PowerPoint, Prezi, or some other similar presentation platform, you will describe what transpired before, during, and after the event and analyze its impact on our country today.

Each presentation must include historically accurate information and must be told from the perspective of the United States. Your presentation **MUST** be presented off of Website (Smore or Weebly), and the link **MUST** be submitted to the appropriate Padlet page at the end of the computer lab date. Your Presentation **MUST** include primary source images and/or video. While presenting your material, you **MUST** become an expert on the subject you are presenting, and must teach the content to the rest of the class. You will also be subject to questioning throughout the duration of the presentation. Lastly, you **MUST** be dressed professionally. You **MUST** follow be presentation ready on the day of, otherwise you will be skipped.

OBJECTIVES

Identify a major historical event between 1970 and present day and analyze its impact on the United States. Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the subject matter through an oral presentation given to the entire class. Bonus points awarded for project excellence, as well as for creating your own video presentation. Your goal is to make the Hall of Fame as far as projects go, so that one day you will live on in rooseveltcpush.com history.

Project Requirements

- A) Digital Presentation
- The Presentations MUST use PowerPoint or a similar program. (10)
 - The Presentation, primary source imagery/video, etc. MUST be housed on either a WEEBLY or a SMORE Website. (50)
 - Your URL Link must be submitted to the appropriate message board online-turn in link the night before you are to give your presentation. (5)
 - You must be dressed professionally when presenting your material. (10)
- B) Time Limit
- The Presentation must be no shorter than 6 minutes but no longer than 10 minutes. (20)
- C) Multimedia
- The Presentation needs to have at least one media element, either a historically accurate and appropriate video/image or audio of a speech. (5)
- D) Written Summary
- You must provide a summary of the historical event featured in your presentation. The summary should include details on who was involved, where and when the event took place, why it is significant, and how the event impacts America today. The summary must include the name of your event, and at least one image from the event. This summary must be in PDF format under a button on your webpage. (30)
- E) Bibliography
- You must submit a bibliography with a minimum of FOUR different credible sources. You must use APA style formatting, and I suggest you use <http://www.bibme.org/apa> (20)

Late Projects **will not be accepted**. You will be graded on whether or not you can demonstrate an in-depth knowledge of your event. Does your written summary cover the topic with detail and context? (The build-up to your event)? Did you provide appropriate images and videos to your website? Make sure you read the project guidelines. There is no excuse for missing a presentation deadline. If your presentation is not ready, you will be skipped. If there is no smooth transition between your website and your presentation, you will be skipped.
