SCENARIO

Individually, you will present on a major historical event that took place between 1970s and present day and CREATE A MULTIMEDIA PRESENTATION THAT YOU WILL GIVE IN CLASS. A list of eligible events is provided. Using PowerPoint, Google Slides, or some other similar presentation platform, you will describe & teaching what transpired before, during, and after the event while analyzing its impact on our country today.

Each presentation must include historically accurate information and must be told from the perspective of the United States. Your presentation MUST_be housed on a Website (Smore, Weebly, Squarespace, etc.), & the website link must be submitted to padlet ahead of your presentation slot. Your Presentation MUST include primary source images and/or video. While presenting your material, you should aim to become an expert on the subject you are presenting, teaching the content to the rest of the class. You might also be subject to questioning throughout the duration of the presentation. Lastly, you MUST be dressed professionally (as if you were going into a job interview, for example). If you are not presentation ready on your presentation date of, you will be skipped.

OBJECTIVES

Identify a major historical event between 1970 and present day and analyze its impact on the United States.

Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the subject matter through an oral presentation given to the entire class.

Project Requirements

- A) Digital Presentation
 - The Presentations MUST use PowerPoint/Google Slides or a similar program. (15)
 - The Presentation, primary source imagery/video, etc. MUST be housed on either a website. (50)
 - You must be dressed professionally when presenting your material. (10)
- B) Time Limit
 - The Presentation must be in between five and six minutes in length. (25)
- C) Multimedia
 - The Presentation needs to have at least three historically accurate images/videos, etc. (25)
- D) Written Summary
 - You must provide a summary of the historical event featured in your presentation. The summary should include details on who was involved, where and when the event took place, why it is significant, and how the event impacts America today. The summary must include the name of your event, and at least one image from the event. This summary must be in PDF format under a button on your webpage. (30)
- E) Bibliography
 - You must submit a bibliography with a minimum of FOUR different credible sources. You must use APA style formatting, and I suggest you use http://www.bibme.org/apa (20)
