### SCENARIO

Individually, you will present on a major historical event that took place between 1970 and present day and **CREATE A MULTIMEDIA PRESENTATION THAT YOU WILL GIVE IN CLASS**. A list of eligible events is provided. Using PowerPoint, Google Slides, or some other similar presentation platform, you will describe & teach what transpired before, during, and after the event and analyze its impact on our country today.

Each presentation must include historically accurate information and must be told from the perspective of the United States. Your presentation **MUST** be presented off of Website (Smore or Weebly), and the link **MUST** be submitted to the appropriate Padlet page. Your Presentation **MUST** include primary source images and/or video. While presenting your material, the goal is that you will become an expert on the subject you are presenting on, and must teach the class about your topic. You will also be subject to questioning throughout the duration of the presentation. Lastly, you **MUST** be dressed professionally. You **MUST** be presentation-ready on the day of, otherwise you will be skipped.

### OBJECTIVES

Pick a topic from the list, or choose your own (Ask Mr. C first) and analyze its impact on the United States. Demonstrate a comprehensive knowledge of the subject matter through an oral presentation given to the entire class. Bonus points awarded for project excellence, as well as for creating your own video presentation. Your goal is to make the Hall of Fame as far as projects go, so that one day you will live on in rooseveltcpush.com history.

## **Project Requirements**

A) Digital Presentation

- The Presentations MUST use PowerPoint or a similar program for content delivery. (10)
- The Presentation, & anything else you want, MUST be housed on your website link. (50)
- The Presentation needs to have at least two media elements (historically accurate pictures/images, video clips, audio, etc.) \*Note\*- Be selective and mindful- If you use a video clip, make sure it's less than a minute (5)
- You must be dressed professionally when presenting your material. (15)

B) Time Limit

- Your Presentation must be no shorter than 6 minutes but no longer than 7 minutes. (25)

C) Written Summary

- You must provide a summary of the historical event featured on your website. The summary should include details on who was involved, where and when the event took place, why it is significant, and how the event impacts America today. The summary must include the name of your event, and at least one image from the event. This summary must be in PDF format and located on your webpage. (25)

D) Bibliography

- You must submit a bibliography with a minimum of TWO different credible sources. You must use APA style formatting, and I suggest you use <http://www.bibme.org/apa> (20)

E) Creation: Create something, either a drawing, a painting, a rap or poem. Create a video presentation, music video, news report, skit, etc... Run it by Mr. Cummings on what it is that you will be creating. (50)

**Plagiarism will not be tolerated. You will be marked down and/or possibly given a zero if you do not cite sources or claim to create something that you did not create.**

Late Projects **will not be accepted**. You will be graded on whether or not you can demonstrate an in-depth knowledge of your event. Does your written summary cover the topic with detail and context? (The build-up to your event)? Did you provide appropriate images and videos on your website? Make sure you read the project guidelines. There is no excuse for missing a presentation deadline. If your presentation is not ready, you will be skipped. If there is no smooth transition between your website and your presentation, you will be skipped...(links & everything all work \*troubleshoot\*),
